


FROM PUSH TO PULL: BARRIERS TO MARINE AVIATION LOGISTICS SUPPORT PROGRAM II MODERNIZATION

Marine Aviation Logistics Support Program (MALSP) Modernization

Commonly referred to as the MALSP II, or the Marine Aviation Logistics Support Program II, this concept transitions aviation logistical support from a "push" system to a "pull" system of sustaining readiness. The MALSP II transitions from a "days of usage" to a time buffer management system attempting to predict future use.



Predicted Findings

- The Deputy Commandant for Aviation's current schedule is too aggressive.
- Software Development, a critical enabler for modernization efforts, is not a program of record and therefore is failing to reach maturity.
- Ingrained Organizational Behaviors must be overcome to embrace change.
- Lack of uniform implementation of End to End (E2E) alignment and CPI initiatives throughout the aviation community are hindering the transition.
