


## Objectives Summary

Analyze the effects of Title II WSARA 2009 legislation on the Program Executive Office (PEO) Combat Support and Combat Service Support (CS&CSS). Review collected program cost data to determine a correlation between WSARA implementation and how stakeholders perceive the application of these regulations.



## Findings

*MDAP cost variability is in more control since the implementation of WSARA*

*Unnecessary and outdated policy reforms still in use complicate a program's ability to execute a streamlined acquisition process and fully implement current reform*

*Alignment of program incentives, including personnel evaluations, reporting procedures, and requirements with reform policy increased policy adherence*
