## SUBJECT: DD 1414, Base for Reprogramming Actions

Given that there are only 6 months remaining in the fiscal year, I intend to expedite the submission of the DD 1414, Base for Reprogramming Actions, to the Congress. Therefore; you are directed to distribute <u>ALL</u> congressional actions including congressional adds, reductions, and those that specify a prorated reduction in the Enterprise Funds Distribution (EFD), Budget 2 Appropriation (B2A) system, which will create the DD 1414, Base for Reprogramming Actions for Fiscal Year (FY) 2018. I request that you complete your initial submission by Wednesday, <u>April 11, 2018</u>. It is extremely important that reports are submitted on time, because the Department will <u>not</u> be able to process <u>any</u> reprogramming actions or transfers affecting FY 2018 funds until the DD 1414 report is submitted to the congressional committees in accordance with section 8007, unless the Secretary of Defense certifies the requirement is an emergency.

This initial submission must include proper footnoting of all congressional special interest programs consistent with the language and intent of the applicable committee reports and sections 8006 and 8007 of division C of the Department of Defense Appropriations Act, 2018. This submission must reflect the budget requests, congressional adjustments, and revised baseline for the following appropriations acts:

- Titles I-IX of the Department of Defense Appropriations Act, 2018 (division C of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2018);
- Department of Defense Missile Defeat and Defense Enhancements Appropriations Act, 2018 (division b of Public Law 115-96); and
- Further Additional Supplemental Appropriations for Disaster Relief Requirements, Act 2018 (division B, subdivision 1 of Public Law 115-123)

For FY 2018 funds only, the Congress increased the dollar threshold amounts for reprogramming funds for the Operation and Maintenance appropriations from \$15 million to \$20 million. The dollar thresholds for reprogramming FY 2018 funds remain at \$10.0 million for the military personnel appropriation; \$20.0 million for the procurement appropriations; and \$10.0 million for the research, development, test, and evaluation appropriations. The Department shall continue to follow the limitation that prior approval reprogrammings are set at either the specified dollar threshold or 20 percent of the procurement or research, development, test and evaluation budget line item, whichever is less.



As a reminder, the percentage change limitation applies to **both program increases and decreases.** This percentage change applies to the program base value at the time of the below threshold reprogramming (BTR) is executed. <u>All thresholds are cumulative</u> from the base for reprogramming value as modified by any congressional action, to include rescissions, supplemental, and approved DD 1415 reprogramming. Therefore, if the <u>net value</u> of transfers into a military personnel (M-1) budget activity; into or out of an operation and maintenance (O-1) budget activity; into or out of a procurement (P-1) budget line item; or into or out of a research, development, test, and evaluation (R-1) budget line items exceeds the identified threshold; the Department of Defense must submit a prior approval reprogramming request to the congressional defense committees.

# MILITARY PERSONNEL, ARMY

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### MILITARY PERSONNEL, NAVY

For pay, allowances, individual clothing, subsistence, interest on deposits, gratuities, permanent change of station travel (including all expenses thereof for organizational movements), and expenses of temporary duty travel between permanent duty stations, for members of the Navy on active duty (except members of the Reserve provided for elsewhere), midshipmen, and aviation cadets; for 284

(a) With regard to the list of specific pro-20 grams, projects, and activities (and the dollar amounts 21 and adjustments to budget activities corresponding to 22 such programs, projects, and activities) contained in the 23 tables titled Explanation of Project Level Adjustments in 24 the explanatory statement regarding this Act, the obliga-25 tion and expenditure of amounts appropriated or otherwise made available in this Act for those programs,
 projects, and activities for which the amounts appro priated exceed the amounts requested are hereby required
 by law to be carried out in the manner provided by such
 tables to the same extent as if the tables were included
 in the text of this Act.

7 (b) Amounts specified in the referenced tables de-8 scribed in subsection (a) shall not be treated as subdivi-9 sions of appropriations for purposes of section 8005 of this 10 Act: *Provided*, That section 8005 shall apply when trans-11 fers of the amounts described in subsection (a) occur be-12 tween appropriation accounts.

13 SEC. 8007. (a) Not later than 60 days after enact-14 ment of this Act, the Department of Defense shall submit 15 a report to the congressional defense committees to estab-16 lish the baseline for application of reprogramming and 17 transfer authorities for fiscal year 2018: *Provided*, That 18 the report shall include—

(1) a table for each appropriation with a separate column to display the President's budget request, adjustments made by Congress, adjustments
due to enacted rescissions, if appropriate, and the
fiscal year enacted level;

24 (2) a delineation in the table for each appro-25 priation both by budget activity and program,

project, and activity as detailed in the Budget Ap pendix; and

3 (3) an identification of items of special congres-4 sional interest.

5 (b) Notwithstanding section 8005 of this Act, none of the funds provided in this Act shall be available for 6 7 reprogramming or transfer until the report identified in subsection (a) is submitted to the congressional defense 8 9 committees, unless the Secretary of Defense certifies in 10 writing to the congressional defense committees that such 11 reprogramming or transfer is necessary as an emergency 12 requirement: *Provided*, That this subsection shall not apply to transfers from the following appropriations ac-13 14 counts:

- 15 (1) "Environmental Restoration, Army";
- 16 (2) "Environmental Restoration, Navy";

17 (3) "Environmental Restoration, Air Force";

18 (4) "Environmental Restoration, Defense-19 Wide";

20 (5) "Environmental Restoration, Formerly
21 Used Defense Sites"; and

(6) "Drug Interdiction and Counter-drug Ac-tivities, Defense".
