Research Objective

Goal: to evaluate the impact of Congress on funding instability for Department of Defense (DoD) acquisition programs.

How:

- Compare requested funding levels for procurement and research, development, test, and evaluation (RDT&E) programs with the actual level of funding
- Identify trends in programs Congress consistently funds above or below the requested level between FY 2010 and FY 2020


Methodology

 Collect data for requested and actual (2 years after request) level of funding for procurement and RDT&E programs from P-1 and R-1 justification books


2. Calculate percent change between request and actual levels at various levels of aggregation (e.g., topline, department, account)

3. Identify trends and priority programs/categories

Congressional Adjustments to Topline Acquisition Funding




Actual Procurement Funding vs. Requested by Department






Actual RDT&E Funding vs. Requested by Department






Average Change in Procurement Funding by Account






Average Change in Procurement Funding by Category

Key Findings

 Congressional action on procurement and RDT&E accounts largely followed similar trends over the past decade, due in no small part to the impact of the BCA and subsequent budget deals

 Congress has clear favorites in procurement accounts that received increases above the requested level on average, including missile defense, shipbuilding, aircraft, and ground systems

• Lawmakers regularly increase RDT&E funding for Management Support (6.6) and S&T Funding (6.1, 6.2 & 6.3)





Army Actual Procurement Funding vs. Requested by Account






Navy Actual Procurement Funding vs. Requested by Account
